Dear Parents and Carers,



Nursery

This week in Nursery we have made some instructions for Jasper to help him stay on green! We thought really hard about what we needed to tell him and why. We think we did a good job, but we tried them out for ourselves by planting some lovely flowers in our outdoor area. We looked back at the instructions each time we finished one to check and double check we were doing in right, because we don't want to be like Jasper and end up off green... We realised that some of the instructions we need to do every day like watering it. We recognised that we might not be able to pick up the slugs and snails because we are not at school when it is nighttime. Miss Gardom will have to do that. We also learned that looking after plants takes a lot of time and there is not ever an end to it! We have to keep doing the watering and keep being patient waiting for more flowers to grow. Hard work! But teamwork makes the dreamwork and we are super excited to care for our lovely flowers.



Reception

This week the children have enjoyed lots of learning outdoors, making the most of the sunny weather we have been having. We planted beanstalks and talked about what beans need to grow strong. In Music we continued learning the songs from Blown Away and Mrs Sale's class enjoyed a visit to Concerteenties where the children took part in a performance. In Maths we explored 3D shapes and talked about their properties. We grouped our recycling into the 3D shapes and explored the unit in search of 3D shapes in the environment. This week we also enjoyed Shakespeare week and looked at the story of Twelfth Night. I wonder if any of the children can tell their adult about William Shakespeare and his plays?



1DP

This week in Art we have been looking at Primary colours. We first looked at the illustrator Axel Scheffler and how he uses primary colours in his illustrations in story book such as Zog the Dragon and The Smeds and The Smoods. The children then had a go at creating their own drawings in the style of Axel using the 3 primary colours. We then moved on to colour mixing with the 3 colours and discovered which colours, when mixed together creates new colours. With the secondary colours mixed we used a range of different thickness paintbrushes to create different strokes and talked about when and why we might use specific sized brushes before creating a painting of our own.



1KR

This week year 1 enjoyed finishing their learning all about halves and quarters. They then moved onto learning all about 2D and 3D shapes by naming them and exploring their properties. In our writing lessons this week we finished our independent non-fiction text all about Paddington Bear and moved onto our Shakespeare week learning. We are learning the famous play 'The Tempest' through role play and acting. In PE with Elite Kids Coaching, we are continuing to work on our target games and ball skills using under arm, over arm and kicking to reach a target.



2KW/SE

This week Year 2 have been learning about food and nutrition in DT. The children found which food items were fruits and which were vegetables by looking for seeds. In Art this week the children used stencils to print repeating patterns onto fabric in the style of Henri Matisse. As well as this we have been learning about William Shakespeare for Shakespeare week and have created a recount by a shepherd from 'A winter's tale.'





2LR

This week in Year 2, we have been designing using repeating patterns. The children used stencils to design and print their patterns onto fabric. We tested two materials, and the children chose what they thought was best to print on. In DT, we tried different foods from Mexico and looked at different techniques of cutting. The children loved the mango and lime. We then made salsa and guacamole and tried them with tortilla chips. In Reading and Writing this week, we have been looking at Shakespeare. We have been acting out the play - A Winter's Tale.



3ED

This week has been all about Shakespeare! We've had a blast exploring his famous stories, meeting unforgettable characters and playing with his unique language through exciting activities!

In art, we have been diving into the world of printing, experimenting with colours to create different moods and bring our designs to life.

We have been learning about Easter Sunday this week, exploring its meaning, traditions and the story of Jesus' resurrection.



3SM

This week, the children have enjoyed William Shakespeare week where they have been able to recall facts about the famous writer as well as hear a variety of his different stories. 3SM focused on 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' where the children were able to develop their understanding of one character in particular, Puck. In science, the children developed their understanding of plants and they ways in which different plants can disperse seeds. Iin maths, the children have created and represented their own data through tally charts and bar charts. They have also developed their understanding of how a two-way table works. In geography, the children have delved deeper into the jobs which people, in particular children, had in the Victorian era.



4MM

This week we had a really a fantastic trip where on Wednesday we travelled to Knaresborough to visit Mother Shipton's Cave. This was a really good trip where we saw the petrifying well that turns items into stone! We also met the stature of Mother Shipton herself.



4NR

What an exciting week for year 4! We headed to Mother Shipton's cave and discovered a magical waterfall that turns everything to stone! We saw a real cannon and the remains of the castle the cannonball had destroyed. The weather was beautiful meaning we enjoyed our lunch and were able to have a little trip to the park! In maths, this week we have looked at calculating the area and the perimeter of different shapes.
