Nursery



Reception

Wow! What an amazing start to the year! This week the children have settled in well to Reception and have demonstrated fantastic listening and attention skills. The staff have spent lots of time getting to know each of the children and we are looking forward the year ahead.

In Handwriting we have been focussing on recognising and writing our names. Our Maths focus this week has been numbers to 5 and counting songs. In Phonics the children are learning the following sounds: s a t I wonder if the children can spot any of these letters in their homes.



1DP

Welcome back everyone. What a fantastic first week we have had. I have been blown away with how well the children have settled into year 1. We are already up and running with our maths, writing, and reading sessions. In maths we have been looking at Place Value to 10. In reading we have been rehearsing and acting out the poem: The Morning Rush and in writing we have been using our phonic knowledge to write short captions.

The children also enjoyed joining the rest of school for our first assembly and have had their first PE session.



<u>1KR</u>

2KW/LH

This week has been an amazing start to Year 2, the children have come back to school with a positive attitude and have enjoyed lots of new learning this week. In Art the children have been learning about how to use different techniques such as layering and tearing to change the texture of materials. We started our first elite lesson this week and learnt about team building games. We have also learnt how to use a compass in Geography using the vocabulary North, East, South and West.



<u>2LR</u>

I am so impressed with how well everyone has settled into Year 2 this week. Everyone has tried their best with their learning. In Geography, we have been using compasses to identify North, South, East and West. In Maths, we have been counting and representing numbers to 100. In French, we have been looking at greeting one another and had lots of practice with the peers in our class.



<u>3ED</u>

Our first week of Y3 has been super! We started off by learning lots of different strategies to help with our reading fluency. Our favourite strategy is sentence tennis where we take it in turns to read with our partner. We learnt all about the meaning of BC and AD this week – we were able to use these abbreviations on a timeline of the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. In maths, we have been wowing with our amazing place value knowledge. We've all tried really hard to answer lots of tricky questions about hundreds, tens and ones.



3SM

Our first week in Year 3 has a been a very busy one. The children have learnt new reading strategies such as Echo Read, Choral Read and Sentence Tennis. In writing, the children have recapped their understanding of capital letter and full stops, as well as identify and understand difficult vocabulary in a poem. Ball skills is our new topic in PE. The children learnt how to dribble a ball with their hands and their feet. We have also had an introduction to the Stone Age, and we now understand why the Stone Age was given its name.



4MM

This week 4MM have been busy settling into year 4 and getting to know each other. We have had fun learning new things about our classmates and learning new things about their new teachers, we have started learning about Buddhism in R.E and learning new skills in math. Well done all 4MM!

Year 4 have had a busy week we have started our History unit learning all about the vicious Vikings, In DT we explored our classroom and outside looking for shell structures. <u>5KR</u>

We are back to school and working hard! From the first day we have been hard at work. In reading, we have looked at fluency in poetry practising both performing poetry and giving each other feedback. In writing, we have begun our portal story, discussing what we remember from our spelling, punctuation and grammar from year 4. In maths, we have begun with some skills from year 4 before we move onto our year 5 topic.

This week, we have started all our new units, learning about Sikhism in RE, life cycles in science and we were introduced to the Romans in history. We have worked so hard already in year 5, and we are ready for the year ahead!

This week we have been excited to explore Year 5 and its interesting units and subjects. In Maths this week, the children have been showing off their understanding of previous learning as well as giving the Year 5 weekly arithmetic test their 100% effort! In Reading and Writing we have been exploring poetry, looking at specific language and vocabulary, as well as the mood of the poem and how it changes. The children were asking really good questions about the meaning of the poem and giving great answers about whether they liked it or not and why. We have started our Science, RE and History units for the half term and have enjoyed our learning so far! Well done 5CT you really have done well this week. (2)

<u>6SW</u>

This week we have got stuck straight back in to our learning! In our Reading lessons, we have looked at the poem of The Raven by Edgar Allen Poe and discussed the vocabulary it uses and the effect this has on the reader. We also looked at a poem called The Ogre in Writing and explored this vocabulary too after writing our cold write suspense story. In History, we revisited our knowledge of monarchs and looked at the changes monarchs made in the 16th and 17th centuries and how their religion influenced the country. Children will all be given logins for our online learning platform Seesaw on Monday where homework will be set each Wednesday. This needs to be completed for the following week. It has been wonderful to welcome our new Year 6s into class this week. We've dove headfirst into learning with and I've been so impressed with the children's attitudes to learning In Maths, we've been revisiting place value including decimals. In Reading, we've been practising our reading fluency using a range of strategies which all lead to a final performance of Edgar Alan Poe's poem, The Raven. Our History topic for this half term is 'How has leadership changed Britain?' and we've begun looking at the Tudor and Stuart monarchs and the impact they had on Britain, particularly around their religious beliefs. Children will all be given logins for our online learning platform Seesaw on Monday where homework will be set each Wednesday. This needs to be completed for the following week.
