

## Nursery

This week has been World Nursery Rhyme week! The children have been exploring a range of different rhymes. They were all so excited to hear which one and the beginning of each day. Together we have made currant buns in the playdough and sold them at the bakery on Monday. On Tuesday Incy Wincy was climbing the walls of the classroom. On Wednesday the children demonstrated their knowledge of farms by collecting all the farm animals and putting them into their houses. The big ship sank to the bottom of the sea on Thursday and on Friday the children were all quiet as mice as the teddies went to bed singing Twinkle Twinkle little star. All the children have got involved and enjoyed spending time exploring the wide range of rhymes. By the end of the week in our phonics activity some of the children could recognise the rhyming pairs!



# **Reception**

This week the children have enjoyed exploring the cold weather. They spent a final week in the KS1 playground and are very excited to play in their new outdoor area next week.

In Writing we retold the story 'Whatever Next' and used pictures to sequence the events of the story. We began our innovation and changed our main characters and began exploring story settings.

In Maths we are continuing to investigate numbers to 5 and focussed on adding 'one more.'

#### 1DP

This half term the children's PE lessons are being delivered by Elite Sports with a focus on gymnastics. In the lessons the children have been learning how to travel and move around safely as well as learning key shapes: tuck, star and pike. The children have also been introduced to apparatus and have been given opportunities to move along the apparatus, jump in a position learnt and land safety. The children are really enjoying the unit of work and are eager to explore more gymnastic concepts throughout the rest of the half term.



#### 1KR

This week 1KR have enjoyed innovating their Gruffalo child stories! We have changed the main characters and the settings in our stories to make them better. In History we are still enjoying learning about transport through time. We have learned all about boats and bikes from the past and have compared them to the present. In French we have learned 10 colours, ask us all about them!



## 2KW/SE

This week Year 2 have celebrated inter faith week and have taken part in activities across KS1 that have taught them about different religions. They enjoyed spending time with Year 1 and Year 3 children and also having the chance to learn with different adults across KS1. In DT this week the children have been learning about joining materials. They tested some joining materials on the net of a cube and decided which ones were strong and also looked good when the net was put together.



#### 2LR

In Year 2 this week, we have been looking at designing our own monsters. We have used expanded noun phrases, adverbs and verbs to describe what they look like and how they move. Yesterday, we explored three different religions during interfaith week. The children loved moving around the classrooms and getting do different activities in mixed year groups.



## 3ED

We enjoyed our Inter Faith Week celebrations on Thursday. We each moved into different classrooms to complete different activities about different religions and beliefs.

We have been looking at the bus stop method in our maths lessons – we have been trying hard to show our working out in a neat and understandable way.

In writing, we have started planning our own 'defeating a monster' tale. Some of our vicious characters include trolls, goblins and dragons. Come and have a read if you want to find out more about these creatures.



#### **3SM**

This week, the children continued to develop their outdoor skills with another Forest School session. They recreated Stone Age art during on the floor and developed their understanding of Stone Age hunting.

In RE, the children took part in Inter Faith week where they developed their understanding of different religions and the importance of showing respect to each religion.

In Science, the children discussed the importance of having muscles in the body and were able to unjumble the structure of an arm, bicep and tricep.



## 4MM

This week 4MM have been busy cooking, we have made Vegetable Paella for the first time, we used our chopping skills and created this delicious dish! We can't wait to make it for our grownups at home! We have also started practising our Christmas concert song!



#### 4NR

4NR have had another busy week in classroom kitchen we made a delicious vegetable paella, we had our third visit to the community shop and make mac n cheese and chicken soup - which were very delicious! In Art we learnt about George Segal and made our own wire sculptures.



## 5KR

This week we begun to write our shared write in writing where we have created our very own suspense text. We have begun a new topic in maths of fractions where we have started to find equivalent fractions of non-unit and unit fractions. In reading, we have continued with our class text of Street Child, we have looked at how authors describe a character's inner thoughts.

In curriculum, we started our science topic where we discussed living things and focused on humans, we created our very own life cycle of a human. In French, we recapped our knowledge of Ice-Creams and how to order an ice-cream in France. We also had Inter-faith afternoon where we did a carousel of activities revolving around different religions. We were able to see other people's faiths and do an activity revolving around this.



#### 5CT

This week the children have done well with having changes to the timetable, we had an interesting visitor come in on Tuesday to talk about the health risks to smoking and vaping, also we explored what the trading standard officers do and the interesting things they have found! The children had lots of different questions to ask. We had inter-faith afternoon on Thursday, where we explored different religions and completed different activities in different classes. The children did fantastic with this and moving around the school smoothly. In our learning, we continued to explore Jim's story in our book 'Street Child'; the children really want Jim to escape from Grimy Nick! We have started our new maths unit of fractions, which will continue until Christmas. The children have shown great determination in their learning in maths due to different method being used and linking the methods to their times tables knowledge. We had a great first Art lesson on Friday afternoon, where we linked our knowledge of patterns into the potter Exekias' work. Another lovely week, well done 5CT.

On Thursday afternoon, we had an interfaith afternoon where we learnt about different religions to develop our understanding of the world around us and the people we share it with. We LOVED creating mandalas and mala beads (even though it was quite fiddley). We learnt all about research stations including the positives and negatives they have; we discussed how they help us understand the world and the environmental impact they have. Our Maths lessons this week were all based around percentages. We worked out how to find a percentage then a percentage increase or decrease. In PE, we continued our unit of gymnastics where we looked at further poses and rolls.



## 6SC

This week we took part in Inter-Faith Afternoon where we visited different classes learning about various religions. We had the opportunity to make mala beads, designed our own Christian churches and created our own mandalas. In Geography, we continued studying Antarctica and looked at how the biome poses challenges for those on expeditions, like Shackleton. We also explored the advantages and disadvantages of research stations. In Maths we've been calculating - percentage increase and decrease in preparation for Black Friday so get your child practising working out your discounts at home!
